





Say a decade of the Rosary as a family, to share your faith at home during this month.

Continuing School Improvement

As a school this year we are working to further improve attainment in writing by encouraging children to read for both pleasure and as a challenge. A rich reading experience helps children to have ideas for their own writing and also extends their vocabulary. Talking about books and new words also helps develop children's confidence.

We are particularly working to improve the attainment of boys in English, overall.

As part of the process, the children get to sample a large variety of pens to use. They choose the pen they find most comfortable to write with and they then get to keep this pen. If they need a new pen or lose their pen, we ask for a £1 donation for any replacement needed. How to Support Your Child's Learning At Home

Staff are often asked by parents how they can help their child at home. Below are some quick tips:

- Demonstrate a positive attitude about education to your children.
- Monitor your child's television, video game, and Internet use.
- Encourage your child to read.
- Talk with your child.
- Talk to them about their homework.
- Encourage your child to use the library.

Mathletics

All children from Years 3 to 6 have access to Mathletics at home. For your information:

1000 points = a bronze certificate

5 bronzes = a silver certificate

5 silvers = a gold certificate

Your child can only get one certificate each week. They will only get a silver or gold if they have completed the required number of bronze certificates first. Silver and gold certificates only are presented at Friday morning Celebration Assemblies.

Safeguarding

Every child is everybody's responsibility.

1) Please remind your child that they must not leave the school site or go through the gate without an adult. (Unless you have given written permission for them to go home alone in Year 5 and 6).

- 2) Make sure we know if someone different is collecting your child.
- 3) If you are a junior parent please do not collect someone else's child without letting the class teacher know.
- 4) if you must drive to school, please park considerately of our neighbours.

Attendance

The class with the best attendance so far this year is 3S with 98.9%. Well done!

The greater the attendance the greater the achievement. Please make sure your child is in school every day and is on time. School starts at 8.55 a.m.

Polite Reminder

Whilst we understand that sometimes children need to attend medical, dental and other important appointments during the school day and that this is often unavoidable, we ask that you send a note into the class teacher so they know to send your child to the school office at the correct time, in preparation for early pick-up. This will help our admin team greatly and avoid unnecessary delay in getting your child to where they need to be. We do ask that you try to avoid making appointments during the school day so that children do not miss out on valuable learning opportunities.

Uniform

Thank you to all those parents who have supported the school by making sure their children wear the correct uniform to school each day. Please ensure your child has sensible black school shoes and a black school coat as the weather becomes colder. The children play outside whatever the weather so it is vital they bring a coat to school every day.

Hair Cuts

Hair Cut Reminder! Haircuts and styles are part of the uniform policy. Long hair must be tied back and fringes should be clipped away from the eyes. If you choose to have your children's hair cut very short, please time this so that, on the return to school, it has grown back sufficiently to meet school requirements, and is generally of one length, with no steps, no shaved symbols and no lines. Girls should have hair extensions and colour, etc., removed before their return to school.

Earrings

After half-term children must only wear small studs. Please change your child's earrings, if necessary, for the first day of the new half-term.

Secondary Applications Deadline

The deadline for applying for a secondary school online is 31st October 2017.

If you still need forms signing, the Dean, Fr Stephen Willis, will be available on Wednesday 25th October, from 2.00 p.m. to 5.00 p.m. at St Sebastian and St Pancras, Hay Lane. You will need to book a time slot on the lists on the table at the back of the Church. Please see the parish newsletter for more information.

Parents must also make sure that they have completed the necessary additional forms and confirmation of Catholic practice, for Catholic school applications. If you do not complete all the paperwork by the published deadlines for the schools you are applying to, then your child may not secure a school place for September 2018. Please do not wait until the deadline but complete all the paperwork as soon as possible.
