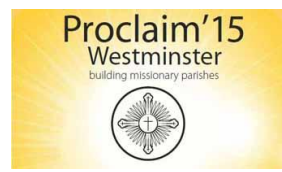

Parking

You may have seen in the press that, in some parts of the country, warning notices are being issued to parents who drive and park dangerously near schools. These warning notices are being followed up with prosecutions. Unfortunately, we still have a small number of parents who show a complete disregard for the safety of our children and local residents when dropping and collecting their children. The Year 5 children were delayed by nearly an hour setting off on their trip because one of the coaches was unable to get to the school due to poor parking which restricted traffic on Slough Lane/Salmon Street. Furthermore, we had complaints from the neighbours that parents also blocked their driveways whilst waiting to say goodbye to their children on the morning of this trip.

These dates are attached to this newsletter for your information. I remind parents that we are no longer able to authorise holidays during term time, and holiday absence is recorded as unauthorised. Requests for special leave for extenuating circumstances, such as funerals and visa applications, must be submitted prior to the leave taking place.

Attendance

Well done to Class 4S who are the only class to manage 100% attendance for one week in January. I would like to remind parents that regular attendance at school enables children to make the best progress.

World Book Day

World Book Day is Thursday 3rd March and the children may come to school dressed as a book character on this day. This also coincides with the official opening of the school Library.

New School Library and Learning Zone

We are very grateful to the Friends' Association for their support of the new Library and their very generous contribution of £10,000 from their funds, which has covered the cost of most of the new books.

The children have begun to use the Library over the last few weeks and are allowed to take out one book at a time. I hope you have enjoyed sharing these new books with your child.

The official opening of the new school Library and Learning Zone will take place on Thursday 3rd March. Father David will visit during the day to bless our learning space and Mr Barry Gardiner, MP, will also come to present prizes to the winners of our Library competitions, outlined on the competition sheet, which will be sent out separately at the end of the week.

Phone Calls From School

If you receive a phone call from school and you are unable to take the call at the time, please make sure you have listened to the message left before you return the call to the school.

Safeguarding

Safeguarding is a high priority for schools. The staff have had updated Child Protection training, including awareness of the issues relating to Female Genital

Mutilation. They have also had training on the Government's Prevent Strategy which relates to the potential radicalisation of children and young people.

Emergency Evacuation of School Premises

We have been asked by the Metropolitan Police to make parents aware that there have been a number of hoax emergency calls to schools in London. These hoax calls are intended to severely disrupt public buildings and the education of children. I would draw your attention to the following advice from the Metropolitan Police which states: "If your school makes a decision to temporarily suspend lessons while safety checks are carried out, please do not attend the school premises to remove your child unless you are asked to do so. And do not phone the emergency services for updates on your child. This delays genuine people in need from getting help. Schools will keep you informed and will always arrange for the care of pupils, making appropriate decisions about their collection and care. Please do not attend and remove your child from school in the event of another school being affected by an alert as this results in missed learning opportunities for all."

If you have any information regarding hoax calls, you may call Crimestoppers anonymously on: 0800 555 111.

In the event that we need to evacuate the school, or children need to be collected due to a critical incident, we will notify you by text with the relevant information.

Please make sure school are told of any change to mobile numbers.
