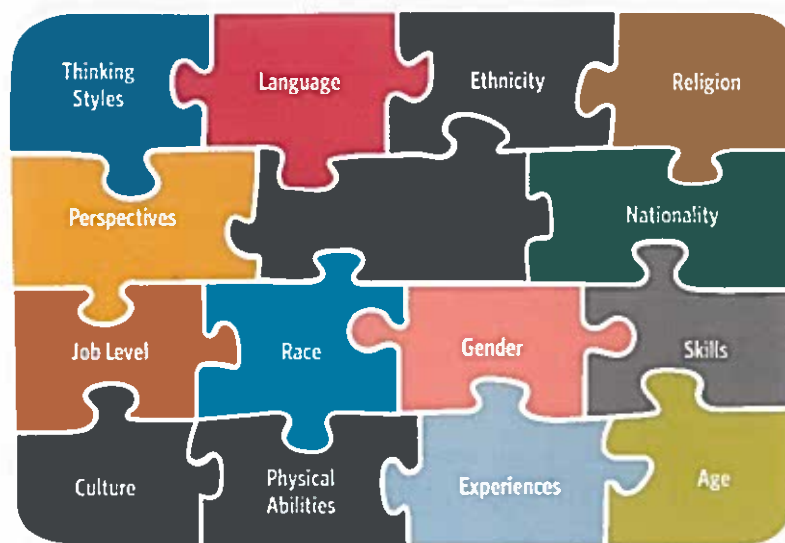

Optional tasks and competitions for Y2 to 6

All children in Y2 to 6 have been undertaking work on prejudice, discrimination and tolerance this half term.

As part of our work celebrating the diversity of the school community, the children are invited to complete one of the optional tasks below:

Tasks

- 1) Family Heritage mobile
Create a mobile of your family, celebrating your skills, talents and heritage. Where are your family's roots, what countries do your grandparents come from, what languages do you speak, favourite foods, music, people who have inspired you? Include family photographs, if you wish. (A shared family mobile would be lovely; it is not necessary for every child to complete their own.)
- 2) Share a Recipe
Copy out a favourite family recipe (on to an A4 page) in your best handwriting. Make sure you include the ingredients and instructions. Decorate the border of your recipe page.
- 3) Design a T - Shirt
Design a T - Shirt with a slogan to stop prejudice, or to show "spreading kindness like confetti."

Following Jesus' footsteps and inspired by St Robert Southwell we work hard, aim high and treat everyone with honesty and gentleness.
