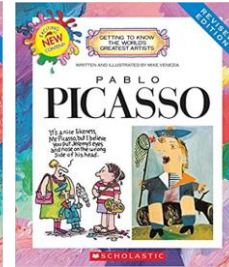
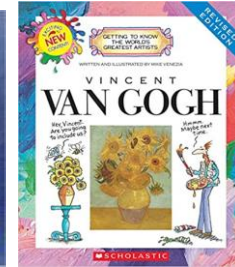
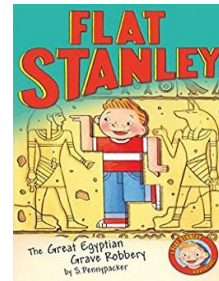
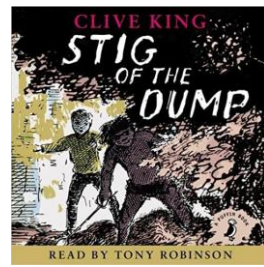
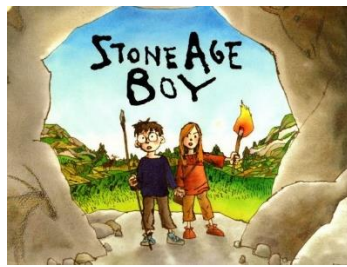
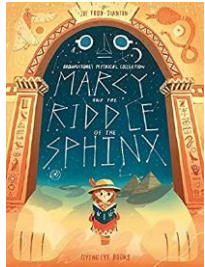
Maths	History	English
<p><u>Number - Multiplication and Division</u> The children will recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables. They will use the facts to answer written calculations and problems.</p> <p><u>Money</u> The children will add and subtract amounts of money to give change, using both £ and p in practical contexts</p> <p><u>Statistics</u> The children will interpret and present data using bar charts, pictograms and tables.</p> <p><u>Length and Perimeter</u> The children will measure, compare, add and subtract using different units of measurement. They will measure the perimeter of simple 2-D shapes</p> <p><u>Fractions</u> The children will count up and down in tenths and recognise that tenths arise from dividing an object into 10 equal parts. They will learn how to find fraction of a discrete set of objects and then move onto numbers. They will do calculations that involve adding and subtracting simple fractions with the same denominator</p>	<p><u>Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age</u> The children will explore what life was like during this period and look at artefacts and tools. They will identify key events on a time line to help them see how Britain changed. They will learn about Skara Brae, one of Britain's most prehistoric villages.</p> <p><u>Ancient Egypt</u> The children will learn about the Ancient Egyptian way of life and what it was like for different groups of people. They will look at how Egyptian artefacts, pyramids and ruins tell us about their culture and religious beliefs and the use of hieroglyphics for communication. The children will learn why the River Nile was so important to the people.</p>	<p><u>Reading</u> Year 3 will enjoy a range of exciting texts, that will be the stimulus for some inspiring writing. They will read about characters who have travelled back in time to the Stone Age and to Ancient Egypt. The children will enjoy Stone Age Boy; Stig of the Dump Marcy and the Riddle of the Sphynx and Flat Stanley - The Great Egyptian Adventure. To support our goal of reading for pleasure, children will also enjoy "Lady Lollipop" by Dick King-Smith.</p> <p><u>Writing</u> The children will take part in role play of the different characters. Diaries, letters and writing in character, will form part of their fictional writing. The children will also explore a range of poems and memorise a selection of them for performance purposes. They will write factual reports and information about Stonehenge and Ancient Egypt connected to the texts. The children will continue to develop their writing skills by focusing on a range of structures that improve and extend sentences. These include using a combination of clauses, connectives and sentence openers. Applying the rules of punctuation will be a key focus as well as encouraging the children to use their editing skills to correct and improve their work.</p> <p><u>Spelling</u> The children will look at the effects of adding suffixes and prefixes to words in spelling activities and will learn how to use different homophone words correctly.</p>

<p><u>Magnets and Forces</u> The children will learn how magnets create pushes and pulls. They will observe how magnets attract and repel. <p>Competitive Games - Hockey</p> <p>As part of their PE curriculum, the children will develop a range of hockey skills to enable them to build towards playing a competitive game against each other. They will learn the skills of dribbling a ball, hitting it and stopping it, getting past defenders and shooting towards the goal.</p>	<p>Portraits</p> <p>The children are going to use a range of techniques and materials in this topic in order produce their own self portrait in paint form and though sculpture.</p> <p>They will start by looking at work by Keith Piper, a British contemporary artist, who uses a range of media to create his portraits and art. We will then transfer to looking at portraits by Picasso and at the famous self-portrait of the artist Van Gogh. They will then look at a range of other portraits with a particular focus on different skin tones and how they can be achieved.</p>	<p>E-Safety-cyber bullying</p> <p>The rules of using technology safely will be ongoing. The children will discuss how to use technology respectfully and responsibly. They will identify a range of ways to report concerns about content and contact.</p> <p>PowerPoint presentations</p> <p>The children will learn how to make a presentation for a specific purpose. They will include the skills of using different animations and slide transitions to produce interesting and eye-catching effects.</p>
